Dr. Sonja Harasim

Dr. Harasim, Assistant Professor of Violin and Viola at Concordia College, where she also coaches chamber music and serves as the String Area Coordinator. In addition to her dedication to teaching, she maintains an active performing career locally, nationally, and internationally as a solo, chamber, and orchestral musician. This is Harasim's first year serving as a mentor in the LRAC Artist Mentor Program.

Harasim is also on the faculty of the International Music Camp, Soiva Music Camp, and the Minnesota All-State Camp, and frequently works with the violinists and chamber groups at the Fargo-Moorhead Area Youth Symphony and the Northern Valley Youth Orchestra. She previously taught violin and chamber music at Rice University's Michael P. Hammond Preparatory School, the Houston Youth Symphony, and Chamber Music of the Rockies. Her students have been featured on Houston Public Radio and have won numerous competitions, including the Houston Youth, Houston Civic, and Clear Lake Symphonies' concerto competitions, as well as the MTNA North Dakota Young Artist Competition. She has given masterclasses at University of North Dakota and St. Olaf College, among others.

A native of Houston, Texas, Harasim began her violin studies at the age of 5 in the Suzuki program at Parker Elementary. Harasim plays a violin made in 2011 by Mario Miralles, modeled after Mr. Lin's "Titian" Stradivarius.

The Historic Holmes Theatre is a renovated 837 seat art-deco era performing arts theatre presenting local, regional and national arts and entertainment events. The theatre has the most amazing and unique penny floor in the world! Thanks to the effort of more than 1,200 people from all over the region, they were able to turn the old, drab floor into a shining example of community-driven art! Complementing their creative floor are the mosaics stair risers leading to the theater's second floor.

Ragamala Dance is LRAC's featured funded event at the Holmes, September 28, 2017.

Under the direction of Ranee Ramaswamy and Aparna Ramaswamy, Ragamala Dance Company's work explores the dynamic tension between the ancestral and the personal. As choreographers and performers, Ranee and Aparna create dance landscapes that dwell in opposition - secular and spiritual life, inner and outer worlds, human and natural concerns, rhythm and stillness - to find the transcendence that lies in between. As mother and daughter, each brings her generational experience to the work - the rich traditions, deep philosophical

roots, and ancestral wisdom of India meeting and merging with their hybridic perspective as Indian-American artists.

Sacred Earth explores the interconnect between human emotions and the environments that shape them. The dancers create a sacred space to honor the divinity in the natural world and the sustenance we derive from it.

Fall Legacy Grant Round due in October

Open to Organizations and Individuals



The Fall Legacy Grant Round will award \$45,400 for art events and activities through out the LRAC region. Legacy Grants have no match requirement and will fund new arts programming, art events, activities, performances, equipment, supplies, workshops, master classes, etc.

The Legacy Organization Grant application is open to:

- K-12 Public Schools and Community Education Departments
- Arts Organizations with non profit status
- Non profit organizations
- Government entities such as towns, cities and counties
- · Libraries and Museums
- · Colleges and Universities

\$31,800 will be awarded to Organizations in the Fall Legacy Grant Round.

The Legacy Individual Grant application is open to:

- All artistic disciplines; dance, literary, music, performance, visual, etc.
- Permanent residences of the LRAC nine county region (six months)
- Individuals only, no existing ensembles, troupes, guilds, bands, etc.

\$13,600 will be awarded to Individuals in the Fall Legacy Grant Round.



The Cultural Community Partnership grant program is designed to enhance the careers of individual artists of color. Artists, at any stage in their careers, can apply for grants to help support collaborative projects. Applicants can collaborate on a project with another Minnesota artist of color or with a Minnesota nonprofit organization.

• Deadline is Friday, September 8, 2017



FY 2018 Partners in Arts Participation

Partners in Arts Participation grant program is designed to broaden opportunities for Minnesotans to participate in the arts. Grant funds may be used by Minnesota nonprofit health or human service organizations to integrate the arts into their programming or services. Applicants may choose to have their constituents engage in existing high quality arts experiences, and/or may work with an artist or arts organization to design experiences tailored to meet the needs of the constituents they serve.

- Mid-Career Professional Development Grant [2 grants, \$5000 each] This grant supports Minnesota-based mid-career artists seeking to expand or advance their careers in the field of public art.
- Early-Career Project Grant
 [2 grants, \$8000 each] These grants support the creation of a temporary or permanent public artwork anywhere in the state of Minnesota by an early-career Minnesota-based artist.
- Early-Career Research + Development Grant
 [4 grants, \$2500 each] These grants support early-career artists in public art related research and development or with the planning phase of freely accessible public art installation or activity in Minnesota.
