Congratulations and thank you Penny, for taking the LRAC Needs Assessment Survey. There were over 140 people who completed the survey and LRAC is excited to take your comments and include them in our planning for FY23.

We learned that COVID had a huge impact on audiences, artist and arts organizations. Everyone seems eager to attend events and recognizes that it will take time and support to get through the next year.



One interesting thing we learned was that all of our ideas for new programing were rated important or very important, with increasing access to the arts for at risk youth having a slightly higher rating than supporting public art in community development, those facing barriers due to a disability, or those over 65 and facing barriers due to age. LRAC will be considering what programing to offer in 2023 to best meet these priorities.


Open this year to Music and Visual Arts disciplines

The FM Area Foundation's community grand round addresses needs in Clay County, Minnesota. In 2022, they will have one grant cycle that aligns with their five areas of impact, including Arts, Culture & Creativity: Inspiring imagination and innovation through arts and culture.

Jerome Hill Artist Fellowship

Jerome Hill Artist Fellowships support Minnesota and New York City-based artists across 8 artistic fields who generate new work that takes creative risks in expanding, questioning, experimenting with or reimagining conventional artistic forms. Fellows receive \$50,000 over two consecutive years (\$25,000 each



year) to support their time and expenses for the creation of new work, artistic development and/or professional artistic career development.

McKnight Artist Fellowships

The McKnight Artist Fellowships Program provides annual, unrestricted cash awards to outstanding midcareer Minnesota artists in 14 different creative disciplines. Program partner organizations administer the fellowships and structure them to respond to the



unique challenges of different disciplines. Currently the foundation contributes about \$2.8 million per year to its statewide fellowships.

McKnight Fellowship for Ceramic Artists

The McKnight Artist Fellowship for Ceramic Artists supports outstanding Minnesota ceramic artists who identify with any methodology: functional, sculptural, relational—all techniques are welcome. The intent of this program is to recognize and support midcareer artists living and working in Minnesota, who demonstrate a sustained level of accomplishment, commitment, and artistic excellence. Two \$25,000 grants are awarded annually.
