Facio will produce a series of performances for the community which will provide opportunities for underserved performers and audiences. He will present makeup application work shops for performers to increase their knowledge and skill in applying effective theatrical makeup for different performances styles. He will capture and document his own makeup creations to build a portfolio of his work along with recording the work of other artists.

Paulette Friday Douglas County \$14,729

Friday will research, write, direct, and produce a show about the prairie pioneer settlers of the 19th century. This production will depict experiences of those who settled the MN prairies in the 1800s. The stories and songs will speak to their dreams and their struggles, and most of all, to their love of the land. Friday will hire the musicians and storytellers to bring this production to life. The performances will feature historical photos in a rear-projected stage background. Performances will take place in the Fall 2019 at Roosevelt Hall, Barrett, and Andria Theatre, Discovery Middle School, and Grand Arbor, Alexandria.

Kathleen Ray Grant County \$8,000

Ray will create an original play that celebrates the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment by dramatizing the history of Minnesota's suffrage movement. She will invite students in West Central High School's 9-12th grade history classes and interested community adults to participate in the historical research and script development. Ray will hire Ann Reed, Twin Cities singer/songwriter, to help participants write original songs for the play. After the script is complete, it will be workshopped, cast with local actors, and performed in 4 venues during the summer of 2020.

Kenyon Williams Clay County \$1,500

Williams will commission an original 5-8 minute duo composition for percussion and flute from Mr. Eryilmaz to be performed at MSUMoorhead in September 2019. The world premier concert will be a part of an all-duo chamber recital that will feature Williams in a variety of "percussion + one" musical settings (flute, cello, electronics, etc). By working with a variety of local artists, he will strengthen Moorhead's musical community by crafting a recital that highlights the skills of multiple performers in a collaborative setting, with the world premier of Erberk's work as a highlight of this collaborative event. During rehearsals and in the workshop, he will work with the students directly to teach them how to breathe life into their puppets with unique characteristics that make them believable. He will also work with students on the fundamentals of puppetry including eye focus, lip syncing and, and arm movement. The production will feature an animated projected backdrop to add the visual experience of an African landscape.

Central Lakes Symphony Orchestra Douglas County \$7,040

CLSO will collaborate with the Minnesota Opera and perform the first act of the opera "La Traviata" and other operatic works for their February 2019 concert. This collaboration joins seven singers from the MN Opera with the CLSO for two rehearsals and the performance. There will be educational programming within the community both at the local public school and the senior citizen center.

Central Square will purchase and install projection equipment (projector and screen) in order to enhance the quality and create more diverse opportunities for future performances. This will meet the technical needs of many of the touring acts by having on site dedicated technical equipment for the enhancement of presentations.

The gallery is open daily during summer months and Fridays and Saturdays most of the year.

Central Square

Pope County

The grant will fund a portion of the rent for the Central Square Box Office and Gallery space, located on the main street in Glenwood. This location improve arts access and supports the work of many artists from the area. Central Square produces year-round arts programming and classes for youth and adults. Each program includes diverse classes that exposes the participants to multiple media of art. This year's production "Wizard of Oz" has a significant number of featured roles for both male and female performers. It is a popular musical with a broad appeal for the young and young at heart.

Henning Landmark Center
