2018 LRAC Grants for Organizations

Three Great Programs to Consider

LRAC invites your arts organization, school, city, or non profit to apply for arts funding in 2018. There are three greats programs to consider based on your organization's status and project. Organizations may apply for one, two or three programs based on their status.

1. Operating Support, \$42,500, Deadline January 9, 2018

(Arts organizations in LRAC region, Annual expenses \$166,000 or less)

- Apply for 10% of your annual expenses to cover the basics.
- \$6,000 maximum award per organization
- Pays for daily expenses, staff salaries, equipment upgrades, renovations.

2. Project Grant: \$18,395, Deadline, February 6, 2018

(Arts organizations and public institutions such as k-12 schools, colleges, libraries, cities)

- Apply for up to \$3,000 per project for arts programming and events
 - 20% match from applicant
 - Multiple applications accepted, \$5,000 cap on total award
 - Pays for performances, artist residencies, workshops, concerts etc.
 - Start Date must be after March 20, 2018

3. Legacy Grant: \$74,200, Deadline March 6, 2018

(Arts organizations, public institutions, and nonprofit organizations)

- No dollar maximum amount and no match from applicant
- Funding for arts access, education and cultural heritage projects
- Pays for new and/or increased art programming and support
- Start Date must be after April 17, 2018

The Jerome Foundation is pleased to announce the first round of a new Artist Fellowship program that offers flexible, two-year grants

to support the creative development of early-career generative artists in the state of Minnesota and the five boroughs of New York City. Artists may apply individually or together with other members of ongoing collectives or ensembles.

The Jerome Foundation supports artists who are:

- imaginative, rigorous, and well-executed;
- technically proficient and exhibit a high level of craft;
- compelling and has a distinctive vision and authentic voice;
- connects with intended audiences/participants;
- engaging aesthetically and experientially;
- bold and risk-taking;
- engaging in exploration and challenges to conventional artistic forms;
- expanding artistic practice within the field and arts community.

Each fellow will receive \$20,000 per year for two consecutive years, making the total cash award \$40,000 over the two-year period.
