2020 Arts Mentorship Program Announcement: Mentorship postponed until Next Summer/2021

Tuesday evening, April 14, 2020, Maxine Adams, Executive Director of Lake Region Arts Council/LRAC presented the LRAC Board members with feedback from Arts Mentorship Program scholarship recipients, Program mentors and LRAC staff. After reviewing this information, and in light of the most recent developments with the Coronavirus Pandemic, the LRAC Board decided it is in the best interest of both students and mentors that this year's Arts Mentorship Program not move forward with an online option. Instead, they voted to postpone the mentorship until next summer 2021 in order to provide a

comprehensive and successful mentorship experience by utilizing our signature "one-on-one" in person format. The postponement until next year is contingent upon the status of the Coronavirus Pandemic and any "stay at home" instructions at that point in time.

We did not come to this decision lightly. First consideration was given to answers from a Mentorship Survey, where the vast majority of students, although willing to do the mentorship online, ('troopers' that they are!) expressed their preference to wait until next summer to work with their mentors, who agree with this strategy. We also took into consideration the information and direction given to us by President Trump's Coronavirus Task Force.

It is an honor and privilege for LRAC to provide both students and mentors with an Arts Mentorship Program experience. Our nation needs the gifts, talent and artistic contributions of students and professional artists alike - more than ever!


Featured Artist

Michael Burgraff: Potter & Artist Extraordinaire

Michael Burgraff, potter, painter, actor, set & lighting designer, woodworker, poet, music lover, teacher and director knew he was destined to be a creative being from an early age. "I guess I have always had and needed a creative outlet."

He began coloring with crayons as a child with his mother, who was also a talented artist, and continued taking art

classes through high school. In college he became immersed in theater. He says "Theater is an intensive art form, especially when taking acting, lighting, set construction, painting and so much more."



Then Burgraff left college to go on a national theater tour and two decades passed without him 'throwing' a single pot. But shortly after his arrival in Fergus Falls, Burgraff met Lori Charest, Ceramics Instructor at MN State/FF who "lit the fire" for good. "It was no longer a distraction. I wanted to become a potter. I wanted to create ceramics. I purchased some equipment from a person leaving Fergus Falls, received a grant from LRAC and set up my own home studio. Now I enjoy time in the corner of my basement creating and listening to jazz."

As Executive Director of A Center for the Arts in Fergus Falls, Michael continues to create pottery and develop his skills. "I am still working on that perfect cylinder. I play my Native American style flutes at night on the deck in the dark, design and build sets for theatre, take pictures with my camera, paint, write poetry and enjoy my pottery time. I truly would be lost without the arts in my life."
