

Dr. Sonja Bosca-Harasim: Violinist, Violist, Professor & Arts Mentorship Program Mentor

Dr. Sonja Bosca-Harasim, performer and educator, has been described as an "undeniably impressive" performer and hailed for her attention to detail, making "every note count deliciously". Dr. Bosca-



Harasim is Associate Professor of Violin and Viola at Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota, where she is Co-Founder and Director of the Concordia String Preparatory Program and serves as String Area Coordinator. She maintains an active performing career locally, nationally, and internationally as a solo, chamber, and orchestral musician. Sonja is the appointed Concertmaster of the Fargo-Moorhead Symphony Orchestra, where she also serves as the strings representative on the Board of Trustees. The subject of her doctoral thesis was dedicated to the performance of new music and little-known works worthy of great acclaim, particularly those composed by Frank Bridge. In addition, several composers, including Karim Al-Zand, Daniel Breedon, Benjamin Krause, Richard Lavenda, Russell Peterson and Christopher Walczak, have written pieces to her.

A sought-after pedagogue and chamber music coach,Dr. Bosca-Harasim is also well known for her masterclasses. Her students have won prizes numerous competitions, participated in prominent music festivals all over the world and have gone onto distinguished graduate programs in music performance and other fields of study.

A native of Houston, Texas, she began her violin studies at the age of 5 and went on to study with Albert Muenzer while attending the critically acclaimed High School for the Performing and Visual Arts. She completed her undergraduate studies with David Updegraff at the Cleveland Institute of Music and returned to her hometown to pursue her graduate studies with Kenneth Goldsmith and doctoral studies with Cho-Liang Lin at Rice University's Shepherd School of Music. 
LRAC Artist Quick Start Grant Six, \$1,000 grants to be awarded


