The FMVA BIG Art Exhibition: At The Hjemkomst Center March 15 - May 16, 2021

For two months each spring, the work of the Fargo Moorhead Visual Artists fills our 4th Floor Gallery at the Hjemkomst Center. The pieces come from art educators, emerging artists, and established



artists from right here in the Red River Valley. The group regularly includes ceramicists, glassblowers, photographers, videographers, illustrators, sculptors, painters, and

woodcarvers — and many of these folks also serve the community as our local teachers, professors, graphic designers, writers, welders, farmers, bartenders, and students. Their work offers one of the largest and most comprehensive local art shows in the region. Each piece is identified with artist statements and each year brings new themes, media, and artists. Jenny Field: Visual Artist Painter - Acrylics and Oil

"I cannot recall a time in my life when I wasn't creating art or planning to create art. I remember being enthralled with the beautifully perfect colorful chaos of nature at a very young age. Inspired and moved by such artists as Kahlo, O'Keefe, Van Gogh, and Klimt, (to name a few), I knew that in this lifetime my primary need and goal was to create art.

My artistic style and technique has gone through several transformations. I am not confined to one concrete style and never wish to be. The current direction of my work is experimental expression through painting with acrylics and oil paints, using vivid saturated color and deeply textural surfaces.

Although my works are created to individually stand on their own as bright subjects of contemplation and symbolism, my goal is to consistently have my work viewed as a colorful, approachable, and relatable experience for the viewer. It continues to be my entire heart and undeniable desire to keep creating art and sharing it with the public."

The goal of the McKnight Visual Artist Fellowships program is to identify talented Minnesota visual artists whose work is of exceptional artistic merit and who are at a career stage that is beyond early career.

The fellowship program supports established artists by providing significant financial assistance, by creating opportunities to meet with local and national art professionals, by organizing a McKnight Discussion Series featuring the fellows and invited critics, and by working with the fellows to create an individualized professional development plan.

The next application cycle will open on January 29, 2021 and close on March 26, 2021 at noon.

Playwrights' Center Theatre Artists



The McKnight Theater Artist Fellowships at the Playwrights' Center recognize theater artists other than playwrights. The Theater Artist Fellowship is open to actors, directors, dramaturgs, stage managers, and theatrical designers (including puppetry). It is also open to those choreographers and composers whose main body of work is in theatre.

The intent of the program is to recognize and support mid-career artists living and working in Minnesota who demonstrate a sustained level of accomplishment, commitment, and artistic excellence. The \$25,000 fellowships are intended to significantly advance recipients' art and careers.

American Composers Forum Composers



The American Composers Forum encourages applicants from the full range of musical styles, and is committed to supporting a diverse pool of artists who demonstrate compelling artistic work. The intent of this program is to recognize and support mid-career

artists living and working in Minnesota who demonstrate a sustained level of accomplishment, commitment, and artistic excellence.

- Four fellowships of \$25,000 in unrestricted funds will be awarded. Awards are subject to state and federal income tax guidelines.
- Fellows also have an opportunity to attend an artist residency program coordinated by the Alliance of Artist Communities within two years of the fellowship program.
- Fellows will have an opportunity to present their work in the Second McKnight Composer Fellowship Biennial scheduled to take place in 2023. Each of the 2020 & 2021 McKnight Composer Fellows will be provided a budget up to \$2,000 to hire musicians and/or defray the cost for the presentation of their work. These funds will go directly to the hired artists or production cost specifically for the Fellow's programmed work. ACF's Vice President of Artist Services in consultation with the 2020 & 2021 Composer Fellows will hire all musicians and coordinate the production of the McKnight Composer Fellowship Biennial.
