## **Featured Artist**

Stephanie Ferrian: Artistic Director of Footnotes Studio of Dance, Dancer, Instructor, Choreographer & Arts Mentorship Program Mentor

Native Minnesotan, Stephanie Ferrian, started dancing at the age of 3. Making the transition from performer to instructor, Stephanie opened Footnotes Studio of Dance in Morris, MN in 2004 and has been at the helm as Artistic Director and instructor now entering their 19<sup>th</sup> season. Stephanie is currently serving as dance faculty at the University of Minnesota Morris and teaches a variety of

courses. Her employment at the University of Minnesota/Morris has allowed her to produce several productions of original contemporary choreography and also serve as choreographer for a few of the University's musical productions. While Stephanie is trained in and teaches a variety of genres, she specializes in tap dance choreography and instruction, and established the 506 Youth Tap Dance Company that is currently in its second season. As a dance teacher and choreographer, Stephanie has spent much of her professional career researching dance as a tool in education and using those principals in her own studio teaching curriculum.

In her choreographic work Stephanie works with dancers to develop the stories they are telling and to examine the interpretations that the audience may assume. She's proud to have had her students showcase their performances regionally at the American College Dance Association Conferences, the Twin Cities Tap Festival, the Minnesota State Fair and to have mentored young adults in the choreographic goals.
